

PRIORITY USE OF MOORINGS:



1. A Licensee always has priority use of their mooring site and their vessel has a red sticker displaying their mooring number.
2. An Authorised User of a mooring only has priority use over vessels under casual access. Authorised User vessels have a yellow sticker with the mooring numbers indicated on it. All Authorised users must contact the Licensee to determine availability prior to use. Two users who wish to use the same mooring for the same period must contact the Licensee to decide who has priority permission to use it.
3. Casual access is available for Licensees and Authorised Users only. The colour code indicated on the stickers indicates the mooring size suitable to the vessel length. Coloured discs attached to mooring buoys correspond to the colour code on the sticker (see below).



A competent operator must be on board the vessel at all times during casual access and display prominently on the port side of the vessel a Rottnest Island sticker (as above). Should you need to leave your vessel for a period not exceeding 20 minutes then you must also display your name and contact mobile number.

If contacted by the Licensee or an Authorised User of the site you must return to your vessel immediately.

If using a mooring under casual access you must move off the site immediately if requested by the Licensee or an Authorised User of the mooring.

CASUAL USE MOORING DISC COLOURS



= not to be used for casual use.



= vessels up to and including 10m.



= vessels up to and including 12m.



= vessels up to and including 14m.



= vessels up to and including 16m.



= vessels over 16m. Lengths vary on each mooring. Maximum size is indicated on the mooring buoy.

REMEMBER:

- Always try to use sites matching the colour code on your sticker to maximise the availability of the larger sites for other vessels.
- Authorised Users must check with the Licensee prior to use to check mooring availability.
- Casual access is for Licensees and Authorised Users only.
- All moorings are used at your own risk.
- Rottnest Island Authority (RIA) also provides rental moorings (green buoys) which must be booked and paid for prior to use by visiting ria.wa.gov.au.



A blue sticker shows a vessel holds a current annual admission permit. No access to any mooring is allowed, with the exception of hired RIA rental moorings. Infringement penalties apply for unauthorised use of moorings and also if boating safety is compromised.
