Location: Thomson Lawn, Wadjemup / Rottnest Island (2-minute walk or 350 metres from the main jetty)

Event Summary:

Celebrate the season of Kambarang on Wadjemup / Rottnest Island with Connect to Kambarang, a vibrant, family-friendly event that honours Whadjuk Noongar culture, creativity, and connection to Country. As the island bursts into life with wildflowers and wildlife, visitors are invited to immerse themselves in a weekend of cultural experiences, including Aboriginal arts and crafts, bush tucker tastings, weaving and dance workshops, and live performances by local Aboriginal artists.

At the heart of the event is the Connect to Kambarang Artisan Markets, showcasing original works by emerging and established Aboriginal creatives, from paintings and textiles to fashion, homewares, and gifts. The event opens with a traditional Welcome to Country and reflects the 2025 NAIDOC theme: "The Next Generation: Strength, Vision, & Legacy", celebrating 50 years of honouring Indigenous voices and the bright future led by young leaders.

This free event is open to all, with registration required. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

Stall Equipment and Setup

- 1 x 3m x 3m Gazebo
- Trestle tables
- White linen tablecloths
- White chairs

There will be no overnight accommodation provided to vendors





Vendor Requirements

To participate in the Connect to Kambarang Artisan Markets, vendors are required to provide the following:

Registered Business Documentation

- ABN 'Australian Business Number'
- Public Liability Insurance
- Local Government Business Registration (if applicable)
- Food Handling Certificate/s (if selling food or beverages)
- Other relevant documentation

Payment Facilities

Vendors must be able to accept card payments (e.g. EFTPOS, Square, etc.)

Staffing

 Vendors are responsible for providing staff or volunteers to operate their market stall for the full duration of the event

Agreement

 Rottnest Island Authority will grant permission (regulation 57 Rottnest Island Authority Regulations 1988) to sell goods via an agreement that will require vendors to report turnover, following the event. Zero commission of sales will be applied at the 2025 event
